'FREE' Extra Grade in GCSE History

Three Strikes	Keep a copy handy at home (maybe in the kitchen) and fire questions at
Revision	your child – just a few each day but make sure it is every day. As you tick
Booklets (x2)	the 'three strikes' columns, the number of topics to revise will reduce.
Memory Palace	There are four A3 posters enclosed. One for each of the eras covered on
Posters	the Medicine Paper. Stick them in separate places around the home that the
	student will regularly visit (e.g., next to a mirror, on the fridge door). The
	idea is that in the exam students will visualise the familiar place in the home
	and also 'see' answers.
Fingertip	There are 100 questions (with answers on the back). These are key facts to
Knowledge	help boost marks for A01 (knowledge). As with the 'Three Strikes'
	documents, 'little and often' is key - maybe ten questions before dinner each
	day.
'Daily 20' and	This booklet has a daily revision task (Monday-Friday) for students to
Instagram	complete. The idea is that they don't waste time figuring out what to look at
	– we've done it for them. If they follow 'maltbyhistory' on Instagram there will
	be a daily resource to help ensure this can be done in just 20 minutes.

We have sent one pack home with each student. I would like to emphasise at this point that this pack is designed to supplement regular revision, not replace it.
