

Questions for you to ask after an interview

At the end of an interview you will be asked if you have any questions. It is a good idea to prepare two or three before the interview so that you aren't caught out.

Remember never to ask about money or benefits, including holidays. It is ok to write them down on a clean sheet of paper and take it in with you.

Types of questions you might ask are:

- 1) Are there any opportunities for progression/promotion?
- 2) What do you like about working here?
- 3) What would be my duties in the first 3 months if I were successful?
- 4) How might my performance in the job be measured?
- 5) What is the team like?
- 6) Are there opportunities for training or education?
- 7) Where do you see the company in five years?
- 8) What would a typical day be for me if I were successful?

If you can write down the answers to the questions this will make you look interested and organised.

Questions to avoid asking:

- 1) What does your company do?
- 2) Did I get the job?
- 3) When can I take time off for vacation?
- 4) Will I need to work on weekends?
- 5) How long would I have to wait to get promoted?
- 6) How long is lunch?
- 7) Does this company monitor Internet usage?
- 8) How many warnings do you get before you are fired?
